125 Years later....

It is going to be an exciting summer in Austin as the Hormel Foods Company celebrates its 125 years in business. What an accomplishment! And a blessing for Austin! George's decision to settle here contributed to the growth our the community significantly.

During the time the Hormels owned their home on Water St. (4th Ave. NW), 1901-1927, the company achieved great success and the Hormel family was active in the community.

George served as an Alderman and was instrumental in getting Main Street paved. He was appointed to the Water and Light Board and helped secure adequate water supply to the city through the drilling of deep wells. Active in their religious life, the Hormels hosted Billy Sunday in their home during his visit to Austin. Mrs. Hormel was active in the Floral Club, the Art and Travel Club, and in music activities at the Presbyterian Church. She shared her beloved home with many in the community.

On July 24th we will do our part to celebrate the 125 years since George achieved his dream of becoming a pork packer. Beginning at 4:30 the Home will be open for free tours and treats. The garden will be set up for families to enjoy a picnic and early 1900's games. A concert will begin at 6:30 featuring a folk duo from the Twin Cities known as *Going to the Sun*. Bring your family and enjoy the property while being grateful for the man who chose to call Austin his home.
